

Much is known about "Mr Blackpool" as an entertainer, broadcaster and recording artiste, but what of the man himself? Reginald Dixon planned to be a concert pianist, but soon found that to earn money he had to be flexible, and gradually developed his church-organ playing by practising on the organs in local cinemas.

He not only played these organs, but he exploited their features to the full. He was left-handed, and soon learned the benefits that second-touch could bring to his playing. He was a fine musician, but had an ingredient that not all musicians possess but wish they had, and that is joie de vivre. He also learned very early in life that holiday-makers wish to be entertained, not educated, and he quickly developed a style of his own that set him apart from all his peers – and that many strive to emulate to this day.

Being organist at Blackpool's Tower Ballroom was a job that enabled him to set up home with wife Vera. The early years were very demanding and his popularity meant he was occupied throughout the long holiday season (not to mention Christmas), was making recordings (done at night, when the buildings were empty), and was broadcasting to the world – for the BBC, Forces' radio, Empire wavelength, and Radio Luxembourg. This left a short "off season" window during which Reg toured the Granada Cinemas in and around London, as well as visiting the EMI Studios and playing at exhibitions, etc.

He retired from full-time employment at Blackpool Tower with effect from Easter Sunday 1970, but it was soon apparent his retirement was going to be anything but quiet! He was soon being asked to play all over the country, and it did not seem to matter to Reg what make of organ, pipes or electronic, or the specification – he invariably managed to deliver the "Blackpool sound" everywhere he went. With the passage of time, Reg felt the need to engage an agent, if only to manage his time, because public demand showed no signs of waning.

Reg ended with a Final Farewell Concert in the City Hall, in Sheffield – although it had been stipulated that the after-concert gathering was for "family only", I am proud to say that Reg kindly insisted that Val, my daughter Dawn and myself were to join him and his family.

Reg was the finest organist/musician I have ever had the pleasure to know, and his popularity continues. I never ceased to be amazed at his modesty, humility and genuine surprise that people should want to keep on coming to hear him. He had a mischievous sense of humour, and there were times when Val and I would meet him before a concert (to give him a lift in my car), and I soon knew if the imminent concert was going to be "special".

This recording of Reginald Dixon, at the Wurlitzer organ in the Pavilion, Bath was made in 1976 – the organ was originally installed in the Regent, Brighton, but had moved to Bath in the 1960s. It was later acquired by Paul Corin, for his museum in Cornwall . . . sadly this has now closed, and the organ remains silent for the time being.
